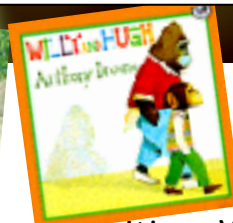
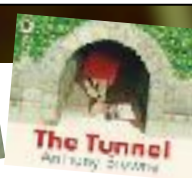
Dear Parents/Carers,

Important Dates:

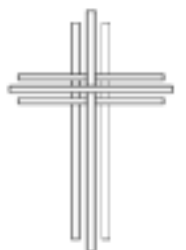
Purple class worship will be on Thursday 26th April 2018 at 9:15.
