

Early Years

Encourage your child to read and write, both through listening to others reading, and being encouraged to begin to read and write themselves as they become more curious about books and writing materials. There are many opportunities to help your child learn to read and write through play and interaction with the real world; for example, reading road signs whilst out walking, getting them a write their own shopping list for a trip to the shops, making marks with a stick in sand or going to the local library and sharing a book together.
