




New Nursery News

Safeguarding (keeping our children safe) update

A reminder that we are an Operation Encompass school. Operation Encompass is a police and education early information sharing partnership enabling schools to offer immediate support for children and young people experiencing domestic abuse. Information is shared by the police with a school's trained Key Adult (DSL) prior to the start of the next school day after officers have attended a domestic abuse incident thus enabling appropriate support to be given, dependent upon the needs and wishes of the child. Children experiencing domestic abuse are negatively impacted by this exposure; domestic abuse has been identified as an Adverse Childhood Experience and can lead to emotional, physical and psychological harm. Operation Encompass aims to mitigate this harm by enabling immediate support, making a child's day better and giving them a better tomorrow. Operation Encompass believes that children are victims of domestic abuse in their own right and should be acknowledged as such. Further information can be found here www.operationencompass.org.

Charity support 2019/2020

This letter outlines that our Schools Catering Service can no longer guarantee that all food and products will be completely nut free due to the number of suppliers now adding “may contain traces of nuts” to their packaging. We can therefore no longer suggest that we have a “nut free” environment in school.

We will, as always, work closely with parents/carers of children diagnosed with allergies to ensure that their needs are met as much as practically possible.

Allergen information

Dear Mrs. Swift,

As you may be aware, there is an increasing number of traces of allergens appearing on the food packaging of some of our stock items and ingredients. This means that some foods may have been produced in the same factory where foods containing one or more of the 14 known allergens are manufactured. For example, a curry powder not containing nut allergens, may have been made in the same factory as a curry powder that does contain nuts. Therefore, the supplier cannot guarantee that it has not been cross contaminated and therefore places "trace of nuts" on the packaging.

Food allergies are diagnosed by medical professionals and dieticians, who generally provide an appropriate supporting letter detailing exactly what the allergens can be.

We request that parents provide a letter from the dietician or GP diagnosing a pupil's allergy. This information must be provided to the Catering Supervisor, so that measures can be put in place to ensure that a child will receive a lunch which is catered to their specific dietary needs.

With this in mind, we are therefore asking for support from both schools and parents when their child is to stay for school lunch.

I hope the above explains our position on allergens however if you have any further questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact me on the above details.

If any parent does have any concerns regarding our allergens policy, please ask them to contact me directly.

June Maths Challenges

Early Years – nursery and reception

Hidden Jewels

Saying how many there are without counting

Children often enjoy hiding games, especially if they involve gems, jewels or golden coins!

Adults could provide 'hide and reveal' games that prompt children to subitise or see the number of the group without counting.

The Activity

Put three bowls over one, two and three jewels.

Quickly lift and replace one bowl and challenge children to say how many there are.

Swap the bowls around rapidly for a minute. When you stop, can they point to the bowl with three? Lift the bowl and see if children can instantly say whether they are right.

Encouraging mathematical thinking and reasoning:

Describing

Can you see how many there are?

How did you see them?

Reasoning

How did you know there were three?

Opening Out

Can you make some different patterns with four jewels?

How can you arrange five jewels so you can quickly see there are five?

Her Mum asked Lucy to pay less than 20p towards it.



Relationships and Sex Education (RSE)

Our school is committed to delivering high quality Relationships and Sex Education which supports all our children to be happy, healthy and safe and becomes statutory for all schools in September 2020. We have already started to plan for the delivery of this work by:

- sharing the statutory requirements at a recent Governing Body meeting,
- appointing an Equalities Lead- Mrs Williams – who will lead on this statutory piece of work
- attending training
- working with other agencies to develop what this will look like in our school.

We will consult with parents/carers during next academic year in preparation for developing our Scheme of Work for statutory RSE. Our school is committed to relationships and sex education, which:

- 1.** Is an identifiable part of our personal, social, health and economic (PSHE) education curriculum, which has planned, timetabled lessons across all the Key Stages
- 2.** Is taught by staff regularly trained in RSE and PSHE (with expert visitors invited in to enhance and supplement the programme where appropriate)
- 3.** Works in partnership with parents and carers, informing them about what their children will be learning and about how they can contribute at home
- 4.** Delivers lessons where pupils feel safe and encourages participation by using a variety of teaching approaches with opportunities to develop critical thinking and relationship skills
- 5.** Is based on reliable sources of information, including about the law and legal rights, and distinguishes between fact and opinion
- 6.** Promotes safe, equal, caring and enjoyable relationships and discusses real-life issues appropriate to the age and stage of pupils, including friendships, families, consent, relationship abuse, sexual exploitation and safe relationships online
- 7.** Gives a positive view of human sexuality, with honest and medically accurate information, so that pupils can learn about their bodies and sexual and reproductive health in ways that are appropriate to their age and maturity
- 8.** Gives pupils opportunities to reflect on values and influences (such as from peers, media, faith and culture) that may shape their attitudes to relationships and sex, and nurtures respect for different views
- 9.** Includes learning about how to get help and treatment from sources such as the school nurse and other health and advice services, including reliable information online
- 10.** Fosters gender equality and LGBT+ (lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans) equality and challenges all forms of discrimination in RSE lessons and in every-day school life
- 11.** Meets the needs of all pupils with their diverse experiences - including those with special educational needs and disabilities
- 12.** Seeks pupils' views about RSE so that teaching can be made relevant to their real lives and assessed and adapted as their needs change

Notes
These 12 points explain what is needed for good quality RSE. This is based on research evidence and is supported by a wide range of organisations. The purpose of RSE is to help children and young people to be safe, healthy and happy as they grow up and in their future lives. RSE must always be appropriate to pupils' age and stage of development and is an essential part of safeguarding. The law requires that, from September 2019, relationships and sex education (RSE) is taught in all secondary schools in England, and that relationships education is taught in all primary schools in England. In addition, National Curriculum Science ("which is taught in maintained schools") includes some elements of sex education.
