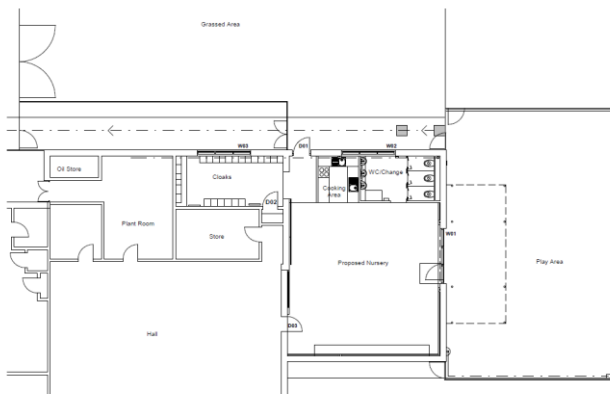

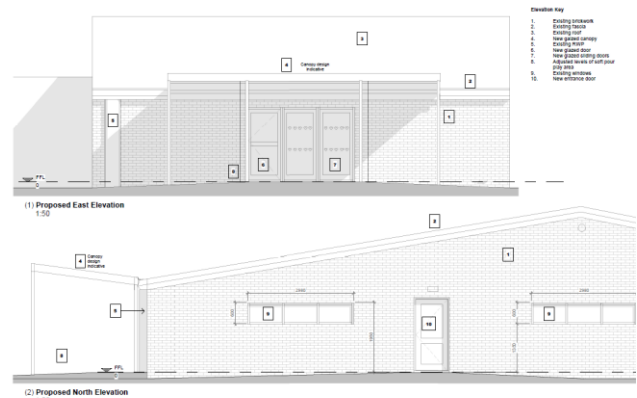


New Nursery News

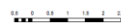
Proposed Floor Plan

Congratulations to **33** children who achieved 100% attendance this year and received a voucher for Manjaros’s restaurant.

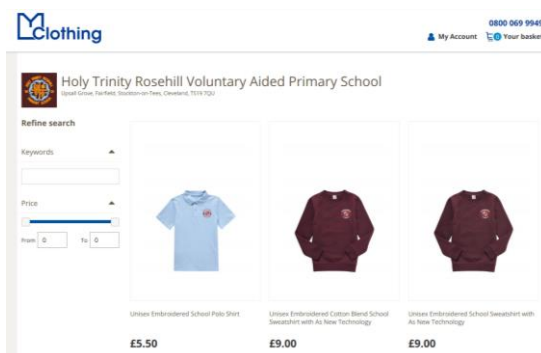

Year 2 enjoyed a lovely afternoon at Preston Park earlier this month where we spent some time completing a trail based on the Julia Donaldson book "Stick Man". After that we went on a very long walk around the park to find each part of the Stick Man story until we finally got Stick Man back to his family. At each section of the story we had to complete a little activity such as matching rhyming couplets, or counting in twos, fives and tens to cross a bridge. Once we had completed the task we were given a sticker on our chart and we were allowed to continue on the trail. It was a really enjoyable afternoon.

We have had a great final month in **Year 3 Crimson Class**. We have been learning Makaton sign language. We performed Fight Song by Rachel Pattern in Makaton to the rest of KS2. As well as this we have been learning about Sweden and Italy which we chose for the Women's World Cup. We have created flag, posters and acrostic poems. We have also taken part in a fun run at Preston Park. It was great fun, we enjoyed getting a t-shirt and a medal!

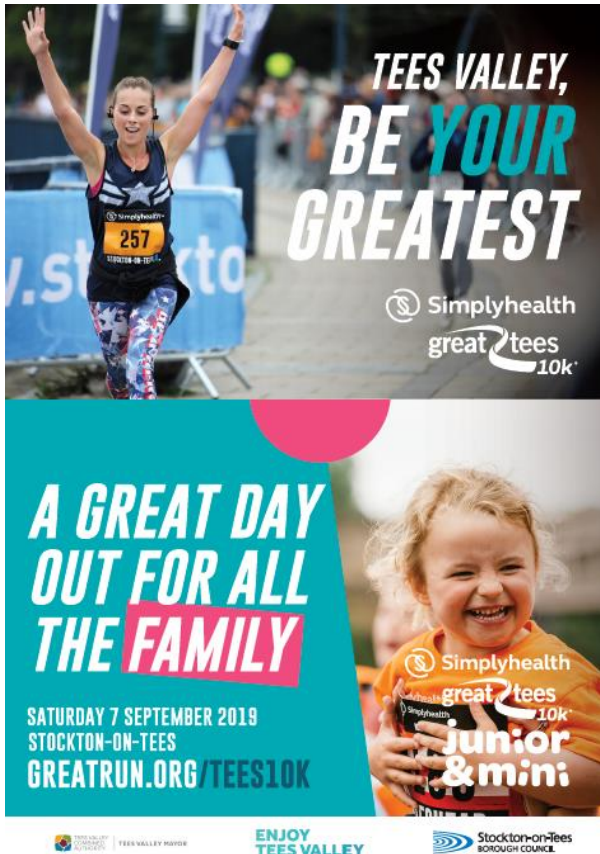
