- Read your school book or a book you enjoy. Can you create a story map or story board after you have finished it? What were the important parts of the story that you need to include?
- Write a list of as many words as you can make using the letters in our school name – Holy Trinity Rosehill Primary School.
- Think about the story of Hansel and Gretel, which we read in class, can you write a different ending for the story?
- Write a letter to your favourite author explaining why you like their books.

Science

- Talk about the foods you have in your fridge and cupboards. Write down the ones come from plants. Do you know which plants they come from?
- Look for some objects around your house, eg. Dining table, sofa, television etc. Draw a picture of them and then label them with the materials they are made from.

History and Geography

- Egyptians believe in life after death, and buried their people with objects that could help them in the next life, and would also show what their social standing was in this life – they are almost like time capsules of a person's life at one point in time. Draw/write about what you would put in a time capsule for your life.

- Practise learning to tell the time. Can you tell the time to all of the 5 minute intervals? Eg. 5 past 2, 25 to 3.

$$4 \times 6 = 24$$

$$10 \times 10 = 100$$

$$60 - 20 = 40$$
