
English writing

- Ask a family member to pick some letters for you. How many different words can you make?
- Can you create your own character and then add it to a comic strip? Use the design on the right for ideas!

English reading


Your child will bring home 2 school reading books and a book from their class library. As well as completing the suggested activities in the back of the school reading book, you may also like to complete some of the following:

- Character description
- Alternative ending
- Blurb
- Book review
- Research the author
- Pictorial storyboard





Draw a shape. ANY shape! It can be basic or it can be wEiRd. Next add some eyes, a mouth, and some arms and legs and — VOILA! — you've got yourself a character!



Simple activities to share!

- Create a treasure hunt with a map and clues

- Invent your own musical instrument. What would it look like and be called?
