## Wing

Watch Wing on The Literacy Shed:

The story is about a lonely humanoid called 'Wing' who is attacked by a group of crows. He tries to escape the forest by building a mechanical wing but he fails. He is grateful for the help he receives from a female humanoid like himself who ends up having one of her wings torn off. The pair eventually escape from the crows by working together.



### English (choose one or more writing activities)

What did Luciano de Crescenzo mean at the end of the animation by the quotation *'We are, each of us angels with only one wing; and we can only fly by embracing one another.'*?

Retell the story in the third person with detailed descriptions of the hero and the crows. Include dialogue.
