Writing

- Write a first person narrative describing the feelings of the farmer, watching tentatively from the windows waiting for the 'green shoots of 1st growth.' This can be a set of diaries exploring the mood at certain points.
- Write letters of complaint to the farmer about how his wind farm is spoiling the countryside, or messages of support for his beautiful crop and his efforts to help the environment.
