September 2020 full opening information

We are pleased to be able to share our plans for full opening in September. These plans are based on the current Government guidance for full opening (schools) and have been developed as a result of our detailed Risk Assessment process. Please find below information which we hope will make you and your child feel prepared for the autumn term. We hope this information will help you and your child to also have a settled summer.

Bubble organisation

Our children will be organised into year group bubbles – apart from our nursery children who will be two bubbles - a.m. and p.m. - and all of our Y1 and Y2 children who will form our KS1 bubble together. Children will be in these bubbles during break times and lunchtimes. We will have the following bubbles:

For most of the day each class will be in their classroom with their class teacher(s) and TA(s). We have the flexibility for children to move within their bubble if needed. Staff are able to work across bubbles to ensure we are providing a broad and balanced curriculum.

Drop off and Collection times

Drop-off - Due to the current Government guidance for September, we will be having a staggered start into school each morning between 8.40am and 9.00am on both Trinity and Rosehill sites.

<p>Rosehill</p> <p>Please drop children off at either gate with a member of staff where your child will then make their way straight into classrooms. Reception children will need to enter school via the main entrance for the first 3 days to help with their transition into school.</p>	<p>Trinity</p> <p>Please drop off children at the gate nearest the school kitchen or via the gate nearest Kipling Grove. Year Three children need to enter school via the Trinity main entrance for the first three days to help with their transition into school.</p>

We request that only one parent/carer/adult drops off and collects children to reduce the number of people on and around our school premises. Please make sure children are dropped off and collected promptly. We also ask that adults leave the gate areas as quickly as possible, do not congregate to chat on and around our school and observe social distancing guidelines. We are asking all child care providers including Boomerang to follow the above drop off and collection procedures.

Packed Lunches

Thank you to those who completed our school meal survey. We have assumed if you did not complete the survey (which closed on Wednesday) that you do not wish for your child to have a school Packed Lunch. Please email school if you require a school Packed Lunch for your child(ren) only if you **did not** complete the survey.
