

Tuesday

Provide opportunities for your child to play with water in the bath, in the kitchen sink, in a washing up bowl or weather permitting, in a paddling pool.

When playing with water children learn:

- to improve their skill at pouring by developing their arm and hand muscles
- how water behaves when you pour it from one container to another
- how water feels and that it can be squirted
- objects either float or sink
- that containers hold the most or least
- that water leaks from containers with holes
- hand eye co-ordination

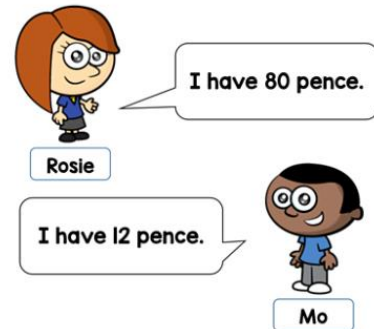
