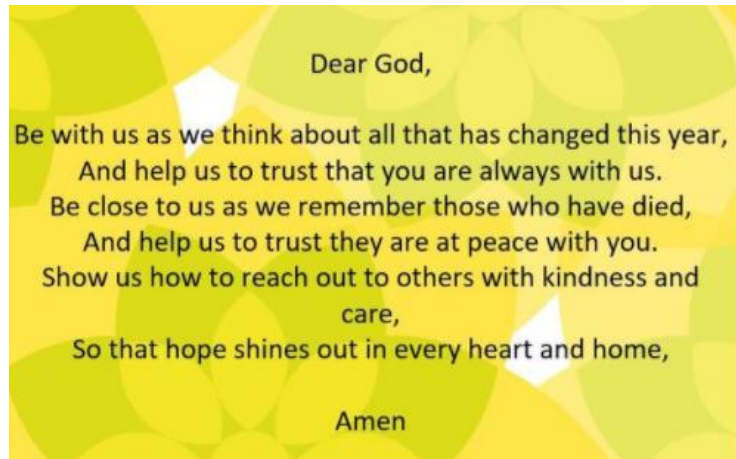

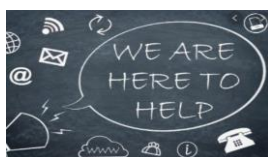


Help and support

As always, staff in school are here to help and to signpost you to support with other agencies and organisations.

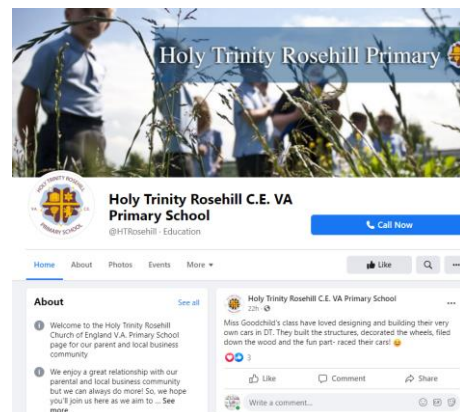

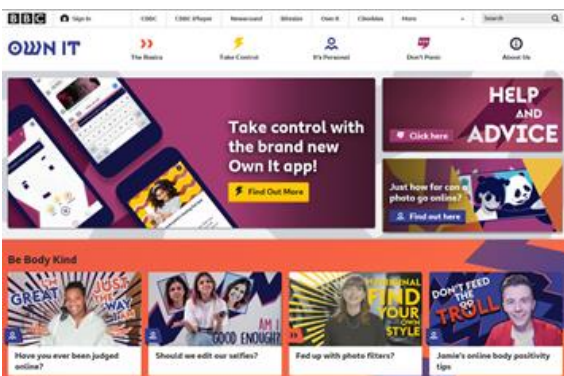




Trinity site one-way system

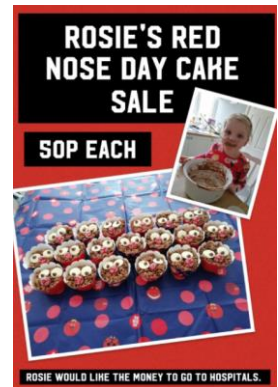


Amazing fundraising by Rosie

Safeguarding our children is everyone's responsibility.

Contact tracing over the Easter holidays

We have been asked by the DfE to continue to provide contact tracing information over the Easter holidays.

We are therefore asking that you email school immediately of a positive case of the virus, where your child develops symptoms within 48 hours of being in school up to and including **Monday 29th March** - this is because your child may have been infectious whilst in school and we will need to identify close contacts and advise on self-isolation. If they develop symptoms more than 48 hours after being in school and then test positive, you should still report this to school and on the NHS website, but school will not be involved in the contact tracing process.

Testing for parents, households and bubbles twice a week

A reminder that regular rapid testing is now also available for parents, their households and support or childcare bubbles (but not primary aged children). The government is encouraging all families to participate in twice weekly testing to help stop the spread. Parents and other adults in the household can access tests by:

- Ordering tests online www.gov.uk/order-school-household-tests
- Getting an assisted test at work, if it is available
- Attending a test site to get tested (where you will be able to see how to take the test) or pick up tests to do at home.

Stockton Stories

Stockton Castlegate Centre are raising money for the charity Bookmark by producing a book about experiences during lockdown and they have invited our children to take part in a competition to write a story, which could be included in the finished product.

Children are invited to write a poem or story about their experiences during the pandemic period. The pieces of writing can be in whatever format they would like to use to express how they have felt during the last year. From funny limericks of Zoom calls gone wrong and home-schooling hysterics or more serious stories about having to spend time apart from loved ones; it is their chance to tell their story, their way.

ABOUT THE BOOK:

Stockton Stories will be a great way to capture everyone's experiences to be remembered in years to come and create a piece of Stockton history, which is why we want to include the local community in the book.

But creating a memory of the last year is not the only reason we wanted to produce our own book. We want to raise money for Bookmark - Reading Charity by selling copies of our book.

We want to help improve children literacy skills in the Stockton area and ensure that local children have not been fallen too far behind because of homeschooling.

We will have 200 copies of the finished Stockton Stories book available in exchange for a donation of £2.50 to Bookmark who will then support local children with their reading. Our target is to raise £500 for Bookmark and we need your help to reach that goal.

Bookmark is a charity that has volunteers who partner with schools to help children learn to read. Please find more information about the charity here www.bookmarkreading.org.

There is no limit on how many stories children can enter, so children may write one at home as well as in school if they wish to.

The closing date is Tuesday, May 4th and you can drop off entries at Castlegate Information Centre. Alternatively, please could you make sure all entries are brought into school by Tuesday, 20th April making sure that the entries are clearly labelled with your child's name, age and class teacher's name.
