Personal, Social, Emotional Development:



Have a developing awareness of own needs, views and feelings. Be sensitive to the needs, views and feelings of others. Have a developing respect for own culture and the beliefs and cultures of others.

Work as part of a group, taking turns and sharing fairly. Understand that there are codes of behaviour for groups of children and adults. We should try to work together harmoniously.

Animal Adventures – What do animals need and how do we care for them?

How to help at home:

Ask your child about how they feel and what makes them happy or sad or excited. Have a chat about making good choices. Talk about likes and dislikes and know it is ok not to like the same things. Let them know that sometimes others have different tastes or beliefs. Work together on a shared activity.

How to help at home:

Play ball games including football. Kick balls at a target. Feel your heart beating faster after you have been running. Encourage your child to write messages on post it notes. Make junk models and talk about the shapes they can see. Cut out shapes with safety scissors.

Physical Development:



Gross motor

Run and stop with care. Throw and catch with accuracy. Develop stamina. Make up and share simple dance routines. Learn simple team games using balls and hoops. Know exercise keeps you fit. Recognise changes in our bodies when we are active.

Fine motor.

Use correct pencil grip and form letters and numbers correctly. Manipulate scissors with care and precision. Use small construction and build with purpose. Using one-handed tools with care to make own projects. Join materials with purpose and care.

Maths:



Number - Correct formation for recording. Finding 1 more or 1 less from a given number. Recognise + and - and =. Use the vocabulary of addition and subtraction. Record using marks they understand and can interpret. Record simple number sentences eg $2+2=4$.

Shape, Space and Measures; use non-standard measures of length and mass. Order objects by direct comparison. Solve simple real life problems related to money and time. Use common shapes to recreate patterns.

How to help at home:

Say a number to your child so they can think of the number which is 1 more or 1 less. Write down simple addition and subtractions for them to solve. Halve numbers by sharing. Double numbers. Use a piece of string and find objects that are shorter, longer or the same length.

Communication and Language:



Reading - Read tricky words and familiar words in reading books. Learn and recognise words through listening and sharing books with adults at home. Read simple sentences. Use computer programmes to consolidate reading skills.. Recognise fiction and non-fiction books.

Writing - Use correct letter formation. Use tricky, decodable and cvc words in own writing. Think, say and then write simple sentences. Recognise that a sentence needs a capital letter at the beginning, finger spaces and a full stop at the end.

How to help at home:

Give instructions with more than two steps. Ask your child to say 'the' and not 've' and 'thank you' and 'think' not 'fank you' and 'fink'.

This will support reading, writing and spelling skills. Encourage sound and word recognition when you are out and about. When writing, count the sounds and count the words in the sentence before they write. Dictate simple sentences for your child to write down. Read, then cut them up and sort the words. Together listen to the tricky word song on YouTube. Look at Phonicsplay.com and play some of the games.

Understanding the World:



Investigate the habitats and food of animals. Find out about favourite animals and where they live. Discover which animals live on land, in the sea and which can fly.

Technology

Record sounds. Develop computer confidence and mouse control. Complete educational programmes using literacy, numeracy and logic skills.

RE

Learn about friendship and know that Jesus is our friend. Know about being a good friend. Think about the prayers we send to God and why.

How to help at home:

Ask your child about their favourite animal, where it lives and what it might eat. Find out facts about animals. Solve simple number problems using the computer. Talk about who are our friends and how we can be a good friend. Talk about how Jesus is our friend and that God likes our praise.

Expressive Arts and Design:



Being Creative

Experiment with collage materials. Choose colours and texture for a purpose. Make observational drawings of everyday objects. View art from different cultures. Use malleable material to make models.

Exploring Media and Materials

Explore colour, form, shape and space in 2 and 3 dimensions. Make objects to support role play.

Music and Dance.

Move rhythmically to music, make up own dance moves and make own instruments to produce a unique sound. Explore how sounds may be changed.

How to help at home:

Colour pages and make sure the colouring is inside the lines. Take a photograph together eg their own face and try to draw it. Make playdough and play with it together. Add glitter and a nice smell. Save household junk and make models. Sing favourite songs together very loudly. Dance too if you have enough breath left!
