How to help at home

Nursery Summer 2023

Literacy

Help your child to attempt to write some letters of their name. Demonstrate to them how to describe what is happening to characters in a picture book and to tell their own story.

Maths

Support your child to use positional language in play as well as by creating arches and enclosures in construction. Also, to create my own simple repeating patterns. Help them to compare quantities saying 'more than, fewer than' and to talk about and explore shapes- sides, corners, straight, curved, flat, round.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Help them to find solutions to conflicts. To know how to follow rules without always needing reminding.
Help your child to engage in pretend play with different roles.

Expressive Art and Design

Help your child to show different emotions in drawing to represent ideas and to mix colours with increasing accuracy. Sing with them so that they can remember and sing simple songs and match the pitch of an adult singing.

Physical Development

Help your child to begin to use a knife and fork independently. Also, to make healthy choices about food, drink, and tooth brushing. To manage large items like moving a long plank safely and carrying hollow blocks.

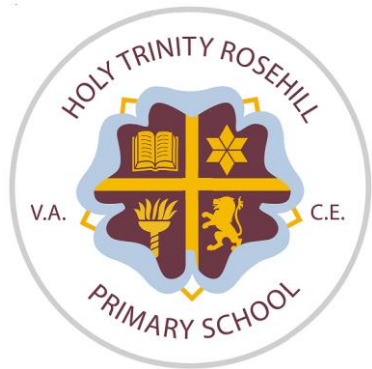
Communication and Language

Help them to start a conversation with an adult or a friend and continue it for many turns. To use a range of vocabulary based on their own experiences.
Support them to join up a sentence in two parts, using and or because, for example.

Understanding the World

Help them to make observations of plants and animals and to grow plants and understand what they need to be healthy. Help children to understand the importance of oral health.

What type of journeys are there?

Literacy



In Literacy we will show awareness of how stories are structured and be able to make up our own stories.

We will begin to clap out syllables in words and recognise when two words begin with the same letter.

Maths



Begins to recognise numbers to 10, understand cardinality and count in order (up to 5). We will also use positional language in play and explore shapes (sides, corners, straight, curved, flat, round).

Religious Education



We are going to find out that the word God is a name and that Christians believe God is the creator of the universe. Also, Christians believe God made our wonderful world and we should look after it.

Expressive Arts and Design



We will learn how to feel the pulse/beat of music and to play musical instruments in our play as well as use movement and sounds to express ideas and feelings. When drawing, we will focus on representing ideas, mixing colours as well as joining different materials and exploring different textures.

Physical Development



We will practise using a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils and to form letters in our name. Also, to use one-handed tools and equipment. We will also learn to begin to use a knife and fork independently as well as put on a coat independently.

Understanding the World



We will learn that the world is made up of lots of places/countries. Also, to continue to make observations of plants and animals. Oral health and why it is important as well as simple forces will also be a focus. Finally, we will help them to recognise their own past from the start of nursery to the end.

Communication and Language



We will be focusing on using the correct tense and to use pronouns for people with increasing accuracy. We will also practise joining up a sentence in two parts, using and or because, for example. Children will practise following two-part instructions and understanding the questions.

RSHE

In RSE we will be talking about who we can go to if we need help or feel worried about something.



Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will be showing confidence and building our self-esteem by being outgoing towards people, taking risks and trying new things. We will engage in pretend play with different roles.
