Religious Education

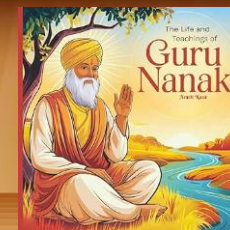
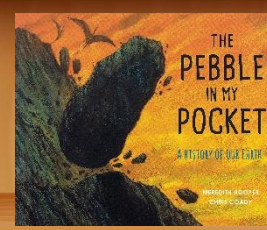
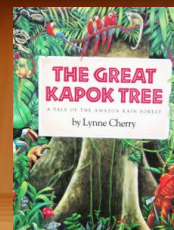


We will be investigating 'What does it mean to be a Sikh in Britain today?' using our theological, philosophical and human and social science skills.

Geography



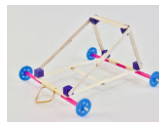
As Geographers, we will be exploring the question, 'Why are rainforests important to us?' by developing an understanding of biomes, ecosystems and tropics.
